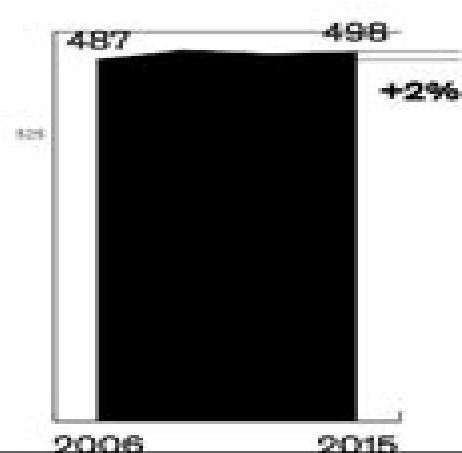
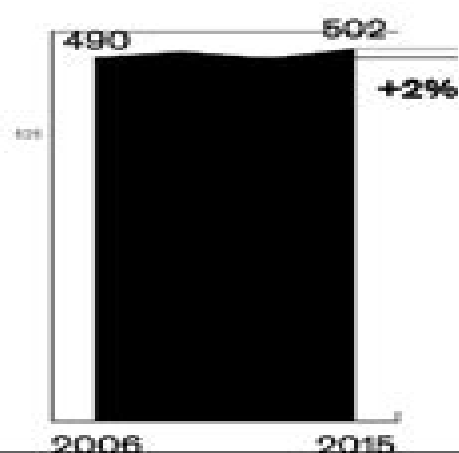
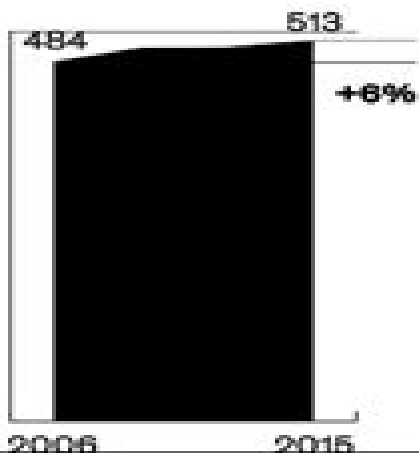
PIRLS¹ reading score
