- Sentence 1: Restate your thesis
- Sentence 2: Summarize all your reasons (*those in the body*)
- Sentence 3: Write your counter argument
(*This may be more than one sentence*)

*****IMPORTANT:** a counter argument can be the last paragraph in your BODY ---if you have more to say than just a couple of sentences.

- Sentence 4: “Zinger” – leave them something to think about(solicitation of support)
