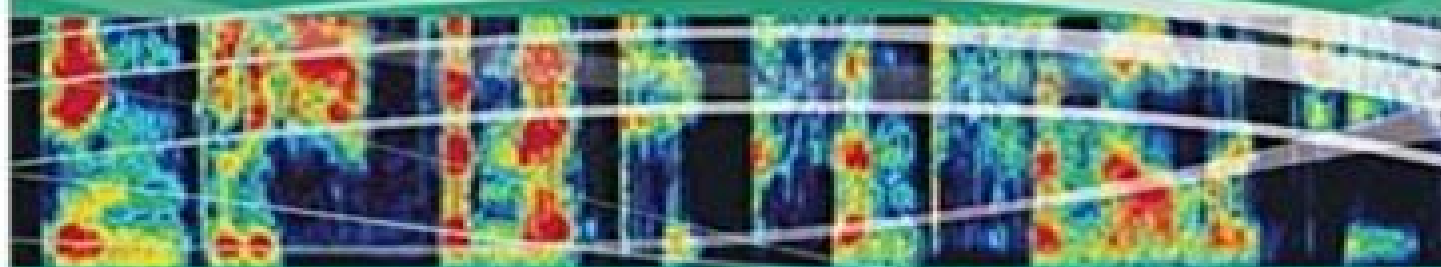

proposed that rejects the current view holding that palatals are positively marked for this feature. The feature coronal is assumed to be privative; the natural class of noncoronals is captured with the feature peripheral which dominates labial and velar in feature geometry.
