- Alliteration of 'darkness drops' and 'stony sleep' underlines the 'nightmare' state of values in society and the need for change.
- A big change is needed so the speaker pleads and prays to God for a 'Second Coming' to the out-of-control gyre and spiral of life on Earth, which is no longer being held together by the forces of heaven.
