Etymological Dictionary of Proto-Celtic Ranko Matasović, 2009 This is the first etymological dictionary of Proto Celtic to be published after a hundred years synthesizing the work of several generations of Celtic scholars It contains a reconstructed lexicon of Proto Celtic with ca 1500 entries The principal lemmata are alphabetically arranged words reconstructed for Proto Celtic Each lemma contains the reflexes of the Proto Celtic words in the individual Celtic languages the Proto Indo European PIE roots from which they developed as well as the cognate forms from other Indo European languages The focus is on the development of forms from PIE to Proto Celtic but histories of individual words are explained in detail and each lemma is accompanied by an extensive bibliography The introduction contains an overview of the phonological developments from PIE to Proto Celtic and the volume includes an appendix treating the probable loanwords from unknown non IE substrates in Proto Celtic
