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General Description

The Kaufman Test of Educational Achievement—Second Edition (KTEA-II) is designed to assess academic achievement for individuals aged 4 years and 6 months through 25 years and 11 months. This individually administered test measures achievement in reading, written language, oral language, and mathematics.

The second edition has an expanded age range, nine new subtests, updated norms, and new data on technical adequacy. The test consists of a Brief Form and a Comprehensive Form. The Brief Form assesses achievement in reading, math, and written expression; the Comprehensive Form covers a wider span of achievement areas and supplies an analysis of examinee errors. The error analysis is said to allow the KTEA-II to be used not only as a norm-referenced test but as a criterion-referenced assessment as well. The Comprehensive Form has two forms (A and B).

Numerous derived scores are possible, including standard scores ($M = 100$, $SD = 15$), percentiles, normal curve equivalents, stanines, and age and grade equivalents. The authors caution that use of age and grade equivalents can lead to misinterpretation of results.

Administration time varies depending on how much of the test is given and the examinee's age, personality, mood, and rapport with the examiner. The four domain composites require about 10 to 35 minutes each. A Comprehensive Achievement Composite can be obtained in 30 to 85 minutes. Word Recognition Fluency and Decoding Fluency add about 2 minutes. Associational Fluency and Naming Fluency require about 5 additional minutes.

Test materials include two easel books, a Student Response Booklet, a CD for presentation of auditory items, a hand puppet, stimulus cards, an Error Analysis Form, an examiner's manual, a Norms Book, a pencil, and a protocol. The examiner may have to supply a student with blank paper. A stopwatch is required for the five timed items and a CD player is needed to administer one subtest.

Description of Subtests

Letter & Word Recognition. For the first 18 items on this 99-item subtest, examinees are asked to point to letters the examiner names, point to letters corresponding to sounds, and to give letter sounds. Reading words begins with Item 19. A number of the more difficult words are not frequently used or phonetically regular. The easel book provides a pronunciation key and examiners are encouraged to listen to the CD for correct pronunciation of more difficult items.
