

The goals of the Initial Preventive Physical Examination (IPPE), also known as the "Welcome to Medicare Visit," are health promotion and disease detection. This document explains the components included in the IPPE. All components of the IPPE must be provided, or provided and referred, prior to submitting a claim for the IPPE.

Review of beneficiary's functional ability and level of safety	<p>Use any appropriate screening questions or standardized questionnaire recognized by national professional medical organizations to review, at a minimum, the following areas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Hearing impairment;</li> <li>• Activities of daily living;</li> <li>• Falls risk; and</li> <li>• Home safety.</li> </ul>

End-of-life planning is verbal or written information provided to the beneficiary regarding:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The beneficiary's ability to prepare an advance directive in the case that an injury or illness causes the beneficiary to be unable to make health-care decisions; and</li> <li>• Whether or not the physician is willing to follow the beneficiary's wishes as expressed in the advance directive.</li> </ul>
