


FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE

SIMILE

When two different things are compared using the words "like" or "as."

EXAMPLE:

The boy screamed **as** loud as a clap of thunder.



The boy was loud **like** a clap of thunder.

METAPHOR

When two different things are compared by saying one **IS** something else. Metaphors don't use "like" or "as."

EXAMPLE:

My sister **is** a monster.



ALLITERATION

When two or more nearby words start with the same consonant sound.

EXAMPLE:

The **b**eautiful **b**lue butterfly **b**umped into a **b**ox.



PERSONIFICATION

When human qualities are given to nonhuman things.

EXAMPLE:

The stars **danced** in the night sky.



ONOMATOPOEIA

Words whose sounds suggest their meaning – like sound effects!

CLANG!

EXAMPLES:

CLICK!

DING DONG

POW!

HONK!

HYPERBOLE

When an extreme exaggeration is used to make a point.

EXAMPLE:

I am so hungry, **I could eat a horse!**
