- Application of a scientific method, tool, or technique. to aid an investigation or judicial proceeding
- Used to support or refute hypotheses about how an event occurred.
- Results integrated into the investigation, part of a Langer Morey
- Many subdisciptions





### Characteristics of Forensic Data and Results

- Specific and complete, including caveats or limitations.
- Reproducible; another forensic scientist provided with the same evidence and information should obtain the same results.
- Fabrifiable: cesults must be stated such that they can be tested for accuracy and completeness. A specific DNA profile or a specific blood alcohol measurement is falsifiable because the results can be confirmed by scientific testing.
- Relevant to the case at hand. The analysis of a bloodstain sample would be done to obtain the DNA profile; cholesterol level in the blood is irrelevant
