the ruins of the small Donbas saltmining town of Soledar, and a fleeting scene from a battle where life, death and injury have been measured in the past week in such near and not-so-near miners.

Vesterday, as Russia's defence ministry said its forces had taken full control of the town, western analysts suggested that, if true, it would be at best a pyrific victory, gained at high cost to fighters from the Wagner mercenary group of Yevgeny Prigozhin, who claimed the town had fallen on Wednesday.

Ukrainian official: denied the claim, suggesting they were still holding on and counteratracking with the tra-

suggested Russian forces were in control of large parts of the fown. Ukrainian forces, however, appeared to remain within Soledar's municipal boundaries still fighting in the north-west, around the sultmine and railway junction.

Crucially, Ukraine still appears to control the road beyond the town, connecting neighbouring Bakhmut and Soledar with Slovtansk and Kostyantymivka, whose capture would further threaten Ukrainium defenders in Bakhmur. What is clear is that the battle for Soledar

and Bakhmut has become emblematic of the current state of the war on Ukraine's eastern from, and more widely symbolic of the state of Moscow's offensive.

Ukraine's president, Volodymyr Zelenskiy, promised on Thursday to provide "everything necessary for human for Soledar and Bakhmut ... promptly and without interruption" as it appeared that even if most of Soledar has indeed fallen, Russian forces will need to actively defend it.
