Think/Write/Share

The purpose of the Think/Write/Share activity is to give students time to think, process, and write before sharing with partners, small groups, or in whole group. (Suggested time: Give students 1-2 minutes to think and write before sharing.)

Students might discuss:

No, Mrs. Schachter didn't see fire; she was under stress and was grieving; she was crazy; it was just a premonition; this is an example of foreshadowing; the fire is a symbol for the events of the Holocaust, etc.

Yes, Mrs. Schachter did see fire. Perhaps she saw some fire in the distance; For Mrs. Schachter, her premonitions were very real, etc.

Why do you think Weiss includes this person in his memoir?

Students might discuss how Mrs. Schachter was expressing the fears they were all trying to avoid, how the others treated her and continued to ignore the danger, how she foreshadowed the crematoria, how this scene created a lot of suspense and tension, how it is might relate to her and her son because he is also just a child.
