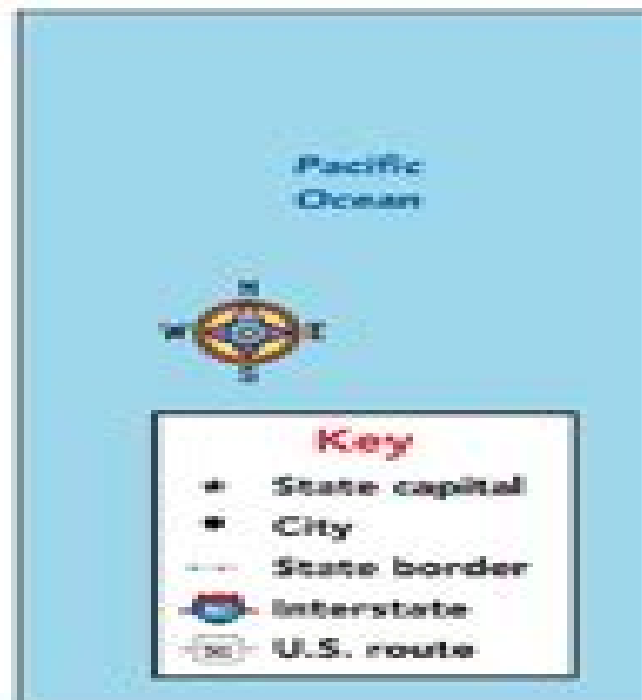


A Road Map
