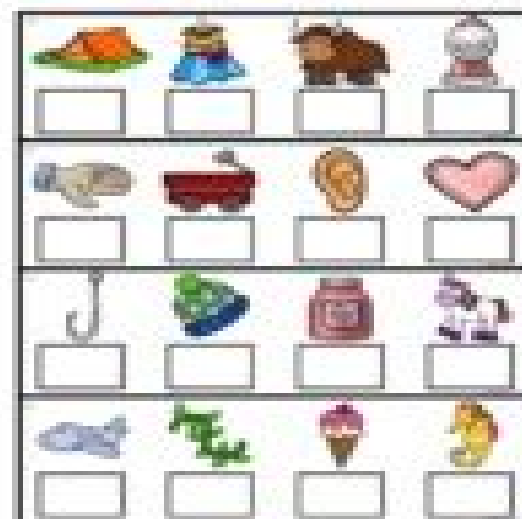
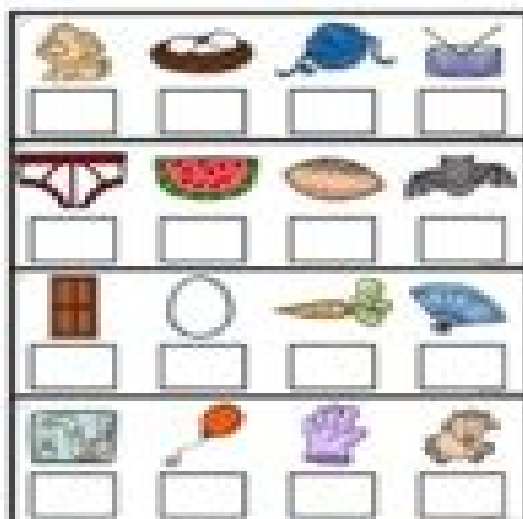
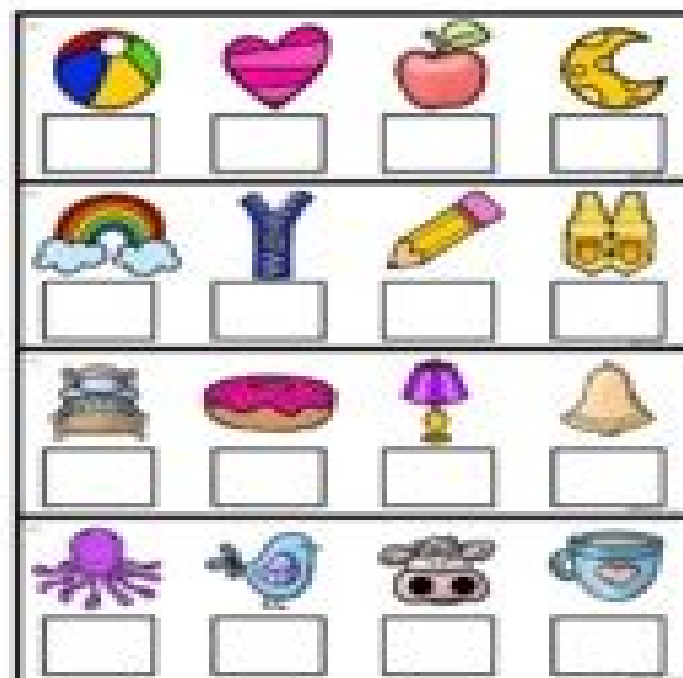


Activity #1
