

Great writers follow an organized process that allows time to trink, time to reflect upon deafts, and time to perfect a piece of writing. The steps of this process are not necessarily linear (that is, something you would follow step by step in a line), but more a finish progression in which you may revisit previous steps (the a circle) as you work to create a perfected final piece.
