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Effectiveness of teachers' guides in the Global South Benjamin Piper, Yasmin Sitabkhan, Jessica Mejia, Kellie Betts, 2018-05-10 This report presents the results of RTI International Education's study on teachers guides across 13 countries and 19 projects Using quantitative and qualitative methods we examine how teachers guides across the projects differ and find substantial variation in the design and structure of the documents We develop a scripting index so that the scripting levels of the guides can be compared across projects.
