the period bookended by these two moments it highlights the enduring concern with factual reference in texts that engage either with current events or the historical archive Specifically it considers a set of ideas and practices centered on the conceptualization and use of documents In doing so it contests the widespread narrative that twentieth century French literature abandons the realist
