SYNOPSIS

The Foresight Future Flooding project has analysed future flood risk in a scenario framework for the whole UK. The analysis predicts increasing flood risk unless current flood management policies and investment levels are changed, with an increase of up to 20-fold in economic risk by the 2080s. The increase is attributable to a combination of climate change and increasing value of household, industrial and infrastructure assets. Potential responses to flooding vary widely under different socio-economic scenarios. The responses are assessed in terms of the three pillars of sustainability (social, environmental and economic). The paper concludes by putting forward strategic choices for future flood risk management.

INTRODUCTION

This paper summarises some of the results from the recent Foresight Future Flooding project (Evans et al. 2004a,b) in which scenario analysis was used to inform the strategic choices that should be made now if we are to address the increased flood risk that may occur in the future. The potential future drivers and impacts of flood risk are assessed for a simple baseline assumption under which the present day approach to flood management and expenditure is held constant under the four
