

STEPS OF WRITING A LAB REPORT

- 1 Start with a hypothesis. For example, "The concentration of fungal spores decreases when exposed to shortwave radiation."
- 2 Write down the steps you took. Write in the past tense. For example, "I took __ and mixed it with __. The reaction occurred immediately."
- 3 Gather all the data. Sometimes it's more convenient to present it in the form of a diagram or a table.
- 4 Provide calculations and interpretation of the results that you have achieved.
- 5 Summarize your work. Compare your results to your hypothesis. Analyze the mistakes and suggest the directions for further research.
