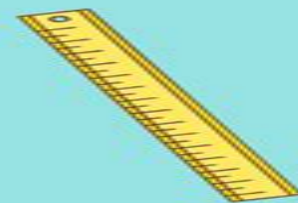


THE BEST STUDY TIPS

MAKE A PLAN

Make a to-do list. Write down everything you need to get done and when it is due.

STUDY WITH OTHERS

Studies show that students who sleep more get better grades. Ideally, you'll regularly get a good night's sleep, but at least try to get some sleep in the night or two leading up to the big test. If you need to, take a nap. Sleep is when your brain processes what you've learned, so there's nothing wrong with taking a study break to get some shut eye.

TRY DIFFERENT STUDYING TECHNIQUES

There are so many different ways to study. What works for one person might not work for another. Try out different study techniques to see what works for you.

- Read and highlight important passages
- Take notes as you read
- Rewrite your notes
- Make flash cards
- Retake old tests and quizzes
- Read out loud
- Explain things out loud like you're telling a small child.

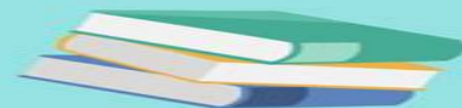
VARY WHERE YOU STUDY
