


## Genetics Practice Problems: Pedigree Tables

Remember the following when working pedigree tables:

- □ Males are affected and squares are unaffected.
- ○ Females are affected and circles are unaffected.
- ◻ ◻ A shaded circle or square indicates that a person has the trait.

The pedigree chart below is the most informative. Shaded individuals are affected. First determine the probable genotype of parents 1 - 11. Then complete the genotype for the rest.



Number 10) provide the genotype of the mother of 11.

The mother (10) had an affected brother (11). He had the recessive but unaffected allele from his mother. Since the mother is not shaded she must be a carrier.

Number 11) provide the genotype of the father of 12 and 13.

The mother (11) had the recessive but unaffected allele from her mother. Since she is shaded she is affected. From her father.

Number number 12 and 13 were affected. How do they have a recessive allele (12)?

The mother (11) has the recessive but unaffected allele.

What must be the genotype of the parents of a non-affected daughter (14)?

To have an unaffected daughter, she must have the recessive but unaffected allele from each parent. Her father must be XY and mother must be XX.

If number 14 marries a normal man, what is the probability that their first child will be affected?
